Our Skill training programs were based on providing various skill trainings to people so that they can earn an extra income. The main aim of this program was to empower women by introducing them to new skills and business models. During last fiscal, thousands of women underwent skill training and became self-employed.

Muthoot Microfin engaged largely in disaster relief operations during the fiscal. MML widely organised relief camps across the affected areas to provide relief materials to the needy. Special task teams were formed in all the affected areas to directly engage in relief operations. MML teams also worked in tandem with civic authorities to extent relief operations to thousands of natural disaster affected people.

Swachch Bharat Campaigns and other activities which promote environmental consciousness among general public were also organised. Such drives included sapling plantation and street cleaning were conducted with community participation.

HEALTH CAMPS

KHAMLA NAGPUR DENTAL CAMP BENEFITS VILLAGERS



Muthoot Microfin's Khamla-Nagpur Branch in Maharashtra organized a dental check-up and awareness camp on April 13, 2019.



The single day camp held in association with Khatri Hospital was organized at branch premises. A team of specialist doctors and medical staffs from the hospital carried out comprehensive dental checkups on around 150 villagers.

The camp commenced with a dental awareness talk, educating villagers about common dental ailments, especially stressing on tooth decay and gum diseases and measures to prevent from them. Those required further treatments were referred to hospital.

Dr Khatri and Mrs Khatri were the chief guests at the camp. At the end of the day, all the participants were provided with tea and confectioneries.

NASHIK EYE CARE CAMP BENEFITS VILLAGERS

Continuing its community outreach activities, Muthoot Microfin's Nashik branch organised an eye care camp at Nashik on April 20, 2019. The single day event, held in association with Contacare Eye Hospital, Nashik was staged at branch premises.

The main objective of the eye care camp was to identify refractive errors of the villagers at an early stage and provide special treatment to the needy. A team of medical staffs from the contacare eye hospital, ed by cluster head Mrs Pooja Sisode, screened 87 villagers for eye diseases out of which, 32 patients were identified with refractive errors and was referred to hospital for further free treatments. Patients with minor problems were given specific medicines for various ophthalmic treatments.

The medical team also provided free diagnostic cards to those clients who require further special attention and tests.





AURANGABAD EYE CAMP OFFERED SPECIAL CATARACT SCREENING



Aurangabad branch of Muthoot Microfin in Maharashtra conducted an Eye Care camp on April 13, 2019. The one day camp, held in association with Vasan Eye Care Hospital, was aimed to provide basic eye care treatments to rural population and also to create awareness on cataract.



Dr Girish and a team of specialists from the hospital conducted investigations and prescribed treatment to nearly 100 participants. Children, women and elderly were among them.

8 patients have been identified as cataract operable cases and were referred to hospital for surgery. Refractive error patients were given special treatments and also given medicines free of cost.

The medical team also provided free diagnostic cards to those clients who require further special attention and tests.

CHITTUR BRANCH HOLDS CANCER SCREENING CAMP

In order to provide free and specialized cancer-screening for people from the rural settings, Chittur branch of Muthoot Micorfin in Kerala organised a camp at Govt. Victoria Girls higher secondary school on May 9, 2019.

79 people from nearby localities attended the cancer screening, held in association with Ottappalam Welfare Trust, Tata Trust Mumbai, and Early Cancer Detection Centre, Kanjikode. Nineteen attendees were screened for pap smear test, 13 for USG and mammography and one availed FNAC test at the camp. The medical team also spread awareness about cancer, including risk factors, symptoms and promoting healthy lifestyle for prevention of cancer.

Earlier in the day, Chittur- Tathamangalam Municipal chairman K. Madhu inaugurated the programme and praised Muthoot Microfin for organising the camp.





HUNDREDS BENEFIT FROM NOIDA EYE CARE CAMP



Noida and Ghaziabad branches of Muthoot Microfin organised an Eye Care Camp in partnership with Young Indians Noida Chapter, CII Noida and Lenskart on Saturday, 18th May 2019 at Ambedkar gate, Mayur Vihar, Khora colony.

The main objective of the eye care camp was to identify refractive errors of the villagers at an early stage and provide special treatment to the needy. Doctors and Optometrists from Lenskart conducted investigations and gave prescriptions to almost 120 participants.

The patients identified with certain eye defects were referred to hospitals for detailed examination and further treatments. The camp was jointly inaugurated by Niaz Noor of Young Indians and Rohit Puri from CII, Noida.


The one-day program conducted by the Balasore branch in association with Red Cross Blood Bank Odisha was held at branch premises from 9 AM to 5 PM.

CHANNARAYAPATTANA MEDICAL CAMP BENEFITS VILLAGERS

Channarayapattana branch of Muthoot Microfin in Karnataka organised an Eye and Dental check-up camp for the local communities on Nov 2, 2019.

The one-day program conducted in association with 'V Care Super Speciality Dental Hospital and Shiva Prasad Nethralaya' screened nearly 150 people for dental and eye related ailments.

Separate medical teams from both the hospitals screened the villagers. People identified with minor dental ailments were given medicines and those with severe issues were referred to hospital for further treatments.

All the participants were screened for eye ailments such as cataract, long/short sights and other complications. Those diagnosed with cataract were referred for free eye surgeries.










HUNDREDS BENEFIT FROM CHULLIMANOOR EYE CARE PROGRAM

The medical team distributed free medicines and gave awareness on lifestyle diseases and factors that impact their wellbeing such as BMI, cardiac function and bone & muscle density.

Nearly 200 families were provided with clean drinking water. The move was aimed at easing the difficulties faced by the villagers during the drought. Following Muthoot Microfin's efforts, some other companies also joined in relief operations in drought hit villages.

NIMAPADA BR. DISTRIBUTES RELIEF KIT TO 600 FAMILIES





Muthoot Microfin's Nimapada branch in Odisha engaged in cyclone relief activities by distributing food and relief kits across the much-affected villages in the region.

The Nimapada team set up a mobile relief vehicle and travelled across 50 villages on May 16 & 17, which were ravaged by Cyclone Fani.

The team provided food and drinking water to nearly 600 families who have been displaced. The food packet included biscuits, mixture, water bottle, Roasted chuda, candle and matchboxes.

The team also coordinated its efforts with the district administration to extend the relief operations.

DRINKING WATER DISTRIBUTION COOLS PURI RATH YATRA PILGRIMS

Extending drinking water distribution drive during the famous Puri Rath Yatra in Odisha, Muthoot Microfin distributed clean drinking water to thousands of devotees on July 4, 2019.

Providing relief from the scorching heat and humid conditions at the festival site, more than 30,000 drinking water pouches, with each pack containing about 200 ml, were distributed to devotees along Rath Yatra procession routes where thousands of pilgrims congregated.

The distribution of clean drinking water was started at 8.00 A.M in the morning and continued till late evening of the Rath Yatra. The devotees were served drinking water pouches in coordination with the district administration. Representatives of the District Administration visited the water distribution centres and appreciated Muthoot Microfin for the efforts.

KAROND BHOPAL STAFFS VISIT OLD AGE HOME







MP REGION HOLDS ANTI-PLASTIC CAMPAIGNS

In an effort to join Govt of India's anti-plastic campaign, Muthoot Microfin's Madhya Pradesh region organised mass campaigns across different locations in the state. The main objective of these programs is to create awareness amongst people and showing them how plastic is wreaking havoc to our environment.

On Gandhi Jayanthi day on Oct 2, 2019, Five branches (Bhopal, Vidisha, Indore, Karond and Sagar) in Madhya Pradesh jointly organised the campaign and distributed jute and cloth bags to local people in 10 villages across the state.

Muthoot team members apprised villagers about the danger of plastic and urged them to discard the use of plastic and encourage people to use eco-friendly cloth and jute bags to protect the environment. More than 1000 eco-friendly cotton and jute bags were distributed to villagers in different locations. These bags are inexpensive

and can degrade biologically in two years.

Muthoot organised the campaign in line with an ambitious national campaign to eliminate single-use plastic by 2022.



AYOOR LEGAL AWARENESS SESSION BENEFITS PEOPLE





Muthoot Microfin's Ayoor branch in Kollam on Dec 6, 2019 organised a program titled 'Legal Awareness on Microloan' at the branch building.

Around 70 people including general public, clients and staffs participated in the single day program led by Adv. Binu (Legal Advisor, Ayoor Co-operative Bank).

The program was aimed to make general public and staffs

aware of their entitlements under the law and apprise them about laws relating to microloans with special emphasis on Protection against fraudulent activities.

Highlighting the importance of legal awareness on microloans, Adv Binu said that stringent laws are formed to provide protection to clients against offences and advised them to get awareness about such laws. He praised Muthoot for organising the program.

MUTHOOT MICROFIN HOLDS DENGUE AWARENESS IN TAMIL NADU, PUDUCHERRY

As a precautionary measure against the outbreak of dengue fever, Muthoot Microfin's Puducherry cluster held an awareness campaign and Nilavembu Kudineer distribution across the regions of Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry on Nov 19, 2019.





The campaign was conducted at the public places including bus stands and market places where hundreds of people consumed the herbal concoction, which is believed to be effective in building immunity against dengue. Volunteers of the campaign urged the public to keep their surroundings clean and hinder breeding of mosquitoes.

YAVATMAL BRANCH HOLDS ANTI-PLASTIC CAMPAIGN, CLEANING DRIVE

Yavatmal branch of Muthoot Microfin in Maharashtra organised anti-plastic campaigns in two villages in the vicinity of Yavatmal on Dec 28, 2019.

Volunteers made door-to-door visit at Karajdov and Chapdov villages in Yavatmal to educate the people about the hazards of single-use plastic. Muthoot volunteers also held a cleaning drive in the villages, particularly removing plastic debris from streets and installed waste bins at junctions.

Further, 1000 eco-friendly cloth bags were distributed to the villagers to replace plastic kits. These bags were environment friendly and degrade biologically in two years. At the end of the campaign, villagers were urged to take an oath to stop single use plastic in all possible ways.





BALANGIR CAMP PROVIDES FOOD PACKETS TO FLOOD VICTIMS

Muthoot Microfin's Balangir branch in Odisha provided emergency food packets and other relief materials to victims of recent flooding.

More than 800 food packets containing Chuda, Rice, Biscuits, Soyabadi, Tea, Mosquito coil and salt etc. were delivered to affected villagers at a relief camp organised at branch premises on Sep 1, 2019.

Low lying areas of Balangir town and nearby villages were flooded due to rains which were a result of recent cyclones in Odisha. Muthoot volunteers also supplied drinking water to villagers.





MANJALPUR & GOTRI HOLD FLOOD RELIEF IN 11 VILLAGES

As had been the case during the previous floods, Muthoot Microfin's Gujarat team have been in the forefront of relief efforts in the affected Manjalpur and Gotri areas in the state this time around as well.

Heavy rains caused devastating floods in these regions and thousands of people have been affected. Hundreds of villages are reeling under water. The flood water also widely damaged houses and agricultural fields at Manjalpur and Gotri. Thousands of victims including women and children are in desperate need of food.

Muthoot Microfin's Gotri and Manjalpur branches have distributed food packets containing lentils, rice, oil, sugar, and salt etc and other relief materials for affected people on Sep 11 and Sep 13, 2019 respectively. Muthoot volunteers also played active roles in relief collection drives and also for the post-flood clean-up in affected areas at both these areas.



At Gotri Muthoot volunteers distributed relief materials in Sahyognagar , L&T circle , Samaa , Madhunagar , Laxminagar , Koyali , Rampura and Akash Ganga villages while at Manjalpur five villages namely Poonamnagar, Paniget, Ajbari, Pratapnagar, and Tarsali were the distribution centres.

MUTHOOT MICROFIN PROVIDES FLOOD RELIEF TO 4500 VILLAGERS IN MAHARASHTRA

Following the devastation brought about by heavy rains and winds across Maharashtra's Sangli and Kolhapur districts, Muthoot Microfin launched a wide scale flood relief operation from Aug 20–24, 2019.

Muthoot Microfin's Sangli and Kolhapur branches jointly organised relief operations across these districts and particularly targeted Kasba Beed, Bhendwade, Chandur, Shivaji nagar, Ankali and Karandwadi villages which were the most affected among others. Most of the areas of these villages were under water and thousands of hectares of crop areas were damaged.

Muthoot volunteers reached out with much needed aid to the residents who were devastated during the onslaught of tropical cyclones formed in the Bay of Bengal. Muthoot opened community kitchens in all these villages and provided food and clean drinking water to nearly 4500 villagers. They also distributed essential commodities that

include food grains and assisted in rehabilitation efforts of the villagers.

Muthoot team also extended help in clearing out debris, construction of temporary shelters and reconstruction efforts.

MUTHOOT MICROFIN DISTRIBUTES 150 SAPLINGS AT PATHANAMTHITTA

In order to mark 2019 World Environment Day, Muthoot Microfin's Pathanamthitta branch organised a tree planting and sapling distribution drive together with an awareness session on conserving nature on June 4, 2019.

In the event organised at branch premises, nearly 150 saplings were distributed to the public. All the participants took pledge to conserve the environment, compensate trees that are being felled, preserve the existing trees and not to indulge in any activities that would cause harm to nature.
