HEALTHCARE & WELFARE

Hundreds benefit from Bagalkot medical camp







Bagalkot branch in Karnataka organised a free medical camp on August 13, 2016 at branch premises. More than 100 people from adjoining rural sectors of Bagalkot took consultation and treatment from the doctors at the camp.

A team of doctors led by Dr. Ananad Herimatta and support staff from the local health department attended the patients. The doctors screened the participants for dental problems, lifestyle diseases such as diabetes and hypertension. Diagnostic tests for blood sugar and blood pressure were carried at the camp.

Free medicines were also distributed to the needy. The participants at the camp were also educated on the need of practicing healthy lifestyle to ward off diseases. Those who required further medical treatment were referred to the District Headquarters hospital.

Medical camp held in Thuckalay





Thuckalay branch of the institution in Tamil Nadu organised a free medical camp for the community on 25th June 2016. Large numbers of men, women and children were screened for various medical conditions at the medical camp held at the Thuckalay branch.

Reputed specialist doctors Harry Godwin and Daphne Sowriga attended patients at the camp. They conducted screening for various ailments and lifestyle diseases. Specialist consultation, treatment and health education were also provided to those visited the camp. Doctors emphasized upon the importance of these screening camps organized by Muthoot Microfin to have an everlasting impact on the health of the local populace. 250 people from the community directly benefitted from the camp.

Vikravandi Eye Care Camp offers free cataract surgery





Vikravandi branch in Tamil Nadu conducted a free specialist eye care camp for the local people on the 20th of August, 2016. More than 250 patients from the locality benefited from the camp, organised in association with Vasan Eye Care, Viluppuram.

A team of doctors diagnosed the patients for various eye diseases including cataract. Those who required cataract surgery were referred to hospital. Follow-ups were done for more than 150 patients who had earlier received treatment for various ailments.

Mr. Senthilkumar S, Inspector of Police, Vikravandi inaugurated the camp. Local administration thanked Muthoot Microfin for organising the camp and promised their full support to all future events in this regard.

Free Spectacles distributed at Alwarthirunagari Camp





Alwarthirunagari branch in Tamil Nadu in association with Aravind Eye Hospital organised a free eye care camp for the clients and general public on June 18, 2016 at AL Mahal, Puthukudi, Srivaikuntam and Alwarthirunagari.

The program attracted nearly 200 people from the locality. Renowned physician Dr. Ramakrishnan inaugurated the camp. The camp was led by Dr Remya and a medical team from Aravind Hospital.

All the patients were examined for eye related problems at the camp and those diagnosed with major problems were directed to hospital for advanced treatments. Patients were also provided with spectacles and free medicines at the venue.

Aurangabad branch holds eye care camp in association with Vasan







Aurangabad branch in Maharashtra organized a one-day free eye check-up camp on 15th July 2016. The major objective of the camp, held in association with Vasan Eye Care Hospital was to create awareness on proper eye care and early detection of eye disorders such as cataract and curable eye conditions among the underprivileged community.

A Medical team examined 150 people from the community at the camp. All participants were screened for cataract and some were referred to hospital for specialised check-up.

The medical team led by Mr Bhaskar Hiwale from Vasan Eye Care provided free diagnostic cards to clients who require further special attention and tests.

Free Eye Check-Up camp held at Indore







Indore branch in collaboration with Vasan Eye Care, Indore organized a free eye check-up camp at branch premises on 26th December, 2016. The objective of the camp was to create awareness on proper eye care and early detection of eye disorders such as cataract and curable eye conditions among the underprivileged community.

110 people attended the camp, held under the supervision of Dr. Gaurav Malviya, Ophthalmologist, Vasan Eye Care, Indore. A medical team from the hospital examined the participants. 15 people were provided with spectacles while 8 participants with major eye defects were referred to Vasan Eye Care hospital for detailed examinations. Some were sent for referral services to the hospital for cataract surgery. Medicines were also distributed at free of cost.

Pollachi Eye Care Camp serves hundreds





Pollachi branch in collaboration with Vasan Eye Care Hospital organized a one-day eye care camp on 23rd July 2016 at Suleeswaranpatty in the outskirts of the Pollachi, Tamil Nadu.

The programme offered free treatment to around 200 people from the locality. All the participants tested their vision at the camp and proper awareness was given on how to take care of the most important sensory organ of the human body.

Six cas es of cataract were identified at the camp, which would be operated upon at Vasan Eye Care Hospital free of cost. Patients were also provided with spectacles at a subsidized rate.

Employees ignite Nagpur blood donation camp





Muthoot Microfin's Maharashtra and Odisha zone jointly organised a blood donation camp on October 1, 2016. 62 employees from the zone enthusiastically participated and donated blood at the event.

The extensive program, held at the Nagpur Regional Office was conducted in association with Life Line Blood Bank, an NGO based in Nagpur. 62 employees from various locations of Maharashtra and Odisha travelled long distances to donate blood and be a part of the initiative.

Dr. Priti Bambal and team from the Life Line Blood Bank headed the camp and educated employees about the importance of blood donation.

Employees donate 45 units of blood at Coimbatore camp

DAIRY DEVELOPMENT

Borsad, Halol branches provide training to dairy farmers





Borsad and Halol branches of Muthoot Microfin in Gujarat on 24th Dec, 2016 organized two separate village level dairy awareness programs for famers. The objective behind the programs was to provide awareness on scientific dairy farming techniques to farmers and to educate them about growing benefits in dairy profession.

Borsad branch organized the camp at Kalp complex, Borsad in the morning while Halol branch conducted the program in the afternoon at BOB bank complex, Halol. 80 dairy farmers from Borsad and 62 from Halol benefitted from the program.

Eminent Veterinarian Dr Jigneshbhai Patel led both the sessions by explaining innovative and mechanized ideas to dairy farmers for improved milk production and to reduce day to day expenses linked with dairy farming.

Highlighting the intent of the camps, Dr Patel also spoke on measures to obtain maximum fertility, common diseases in cattle and vaccination schedules. The sessions also gave insights on proper sheltering of cattle and disease prevention.

Dairy farmers learn new techniques at Yavatmal camp

Yavatmal branch in Maharashtra organised a one day Dairy Awareness Programme on June 27, 2016. The awareness session, held at Yamatval branch office benefitted 75 dairy farmers from the locality.

He also emphasized on the topics of breed selection, care & management of calves, feed & nutrition, farm sanitation & hygiene and livestock insurance schemes.

Digital financial literacy session held at Khamla





Following government's digitalisation initiatives, Muthoot Microfin conducted an awareness camp on the subject on 23rd Dec, 2016 at Khamla near Nagpur in Maharashtra.

The main objective of the program held in association with Axis bank, Nagpur was to spread awareness about digitalisation of the economy and the procedures involved in executing cashless transactions.

Nearly 100 local community members participated in the program. Experts from the bank introduced E-wallets and debit/credit cards to the participants. They also demonstrated how people can use e-wallets in their phone and how to download and install it. They also undertook sessions on safety measures to be applied while banking with electronic devices.

Muthoot Microfin conducts financial literacy sessions and awareness programs across its operating areas to educate and empower rural population in the country.

Cuttack & Yavatmal hold Digital financial literacy sessions







Yavatmal and Cuttack branches organised two separate financial literacy trainings for rural communities. Both the programs organised on the backdrop of demonetisation were attended by hundreds of people from the locality.

More than 120 customers participated in the Cuttack program held in the branch premises on Dec 17, 2016; while more than 100 people attended the Yavatmal program held at Navjivan Mangal Karyalay on Dec 19, 2016.

Speakers at both the venues highlighted the various measures to deal with the present cash crunch scenario and explained about different mode of cashless transactions and also answered queries raised by the participants. The participants showed their enthusiasm and asked several questions to the speakers. The programmes helped the participants to understand various processes, products, and documentations of banking in general.

Mr. Kunal Kamble from UCO bank, led the sessions in Yavatmal. He explained to participants the importance of cashless transactions in the present situation.

Nashik, Moodabidri programs offer digital financial literacy

All the participants were given training on how to use Mobile banking Apps, digital wallets, internet banking and using credit/debit cards.

Bhubaneswar holds financial literacy camp







Bhubaneswar branch of Muthoot Microfin in Odisha organized a Financial Literacy session for women entrepreneurs on August 11 at the Branch premises.

Digitalisation: Financial Literacy training at Ichalkaranji

Through the training, 160 participants were introduced to the latest digital means of financial transactions and other banking facilities. The program was conducted in association with Union Bank of India and Vodafone M Pesa from 9.30 am to 5.30 PM on branch premises.

Mr Abhijeet Deshmukh, Asst Branch Manager, Union Bank of India, Ichalkaranji held a session on Cashless Banking Process, Bank Account Opening Process, Advantages of Banking and Cashless transactions using a common mobile without internet connections.

Mr Sachin Lokare, BDM Vodafone M pesa took a study class on the benefits of using Vodafone M pesa in daily transactions and conducted a demonstration with a Q&A session to clarify the participants doubts.

Later in the day, other hands-on sessions were included in the workshop to develop the participants' skills in dealing with different means of using cashless transactions.

SKILL TRAINING

Kundapura camp provides skill training to women







Kundapura branch in Karnataka conducted Skill Training Workshop for women at branch premises on August 20, 2016.

Renowned trainer Mr Jeevan, who was the resource person at the program, inaugurated the workshop. He along with other trainers Mrs Geetha and Mrs Harinakshi provided skill trainings to more than 150 participants on making various items like detergent soap/powder, oil, agarbathi, candles etc.

Making paint from waste items and making mats from packaged tetra packs were the highlights of the workshop. To address the unemployment issues faced by rural women, Muthoot Microfin had been conducting skill training workshops since it began operations in 2010. These programs will provide livelihood training programs and educational workshops to hundreds of women across the country.

Madathara Branch Holds Health Awareness & Skill Training Camp





Madathara branch in Kollam, Kerala organised a health awareness and skill training workshop on 18th June 2016. Nearly 100 people participated in the camp held at YMCA Hall, Kulathupuzha. Panchayath member Mrs Laila Beevi inaugurated the camp. She distributed study materials to students belonging to the weaker sections of the society. Mr Tijo Varghese from NRHM addressed the audience and made a lecture on common health issues. Later in the day, CSR Facilitator conducted skill training on paper carry bag making which was attended by 50 women from the local community.

Omassery Skill Camp motivates women entrepreneurs







Omassery branch in Kozhikode district, Kerala organised a one-day skill workshop on Embroidery and Glass painting on 23rd July 2016.

The programme held in an attempt to enrich the skills of village women and enable them to start their own micro businesses, evoked virtuous response from local women. During the sessions, expert trainers taught all the 40 participants various skills in glass painting and embroidery. Participants thanked Muthoot Microfin for organising the skill workshop with the objective of helping them to acquire knowledge and vocational skills.

Embroidery skills workshop held at Nileshwaram

Vadakara branch in Kerala on 20th August, 2016 conducted a skill training workshop for women entrepreneurs on making handmade soap and soap powder.

40 women from in and around the branch locality attended the workshop held at branch premises. All the participants were provided with technical support apart from raw materials for the production of soap items at the program. The training also offered marketing tips to the participants.

Muthoot Microfin conducts skill workshops across its operating States targeting budding women entrepreneurs from rural sectors. The emphasis of these camps is on providing practical training to manufacture products on a commercially viable basis.

Crafts skill training for clients in Agastheeswaram

Muthoot Microfin distributes 50,000 litres of drinking water to drought hit Latur, Maharashtra.



Muthoot Microfin intervened to help out the drought hit communities in Latur district of Maharashtra by distributing 50,000 litres of drinking water for the people.

Tens of thousands of people in Latur district of Maharashtra is struggling facing the consequences of an extended drought and acute water scarcity. For the farmers, all their crops are damaged and the common man is helplessly witnessing the collapse of water supply infrastructure in the overcrowded areas.

Muthoot Microfin collected 50,000 litres of drinking water from other districts of Maharashtra and brought it to Latur in 20 tanker lorries containing 2,500 litres of drinking water each. The company distributed water among 500 families in severely drought hit areas with 100 litres of water for each family. This is expected to help the natives go on for another week with supply of safe drinking water.

The local leaders of the area Mr. Rambhou Kombde (Nagar Sevak) and Mr Sanjay Dada Ohal (President of local party RNS) lauded efforts of the company and appreciated the hard work behind successfully executing this initiative.

The staff of the company in the region engaged whole heartedly and put their hard work towards the successful coordination of the initiative. The people in the area were also requested to gather for a brief awareness session on proper usage of the water and rain water harvesting techniques for future.

Muthoot Microfin delivers food kits to Beed flood victims



In response to the flash flood disaster in Kolhapur district of Maharashtra that left many people without basic necessities, Muthoot Microfin distributed free food kits to flood-affected households.

In Beed, one of the worst affected villages in the flood, Muthoot Microfin distributed food kits that include rice, dal and cooking oil apart from other relief supplies and hygiene kits to about 75 households on July 20, 2016.

Beed village Sarpanch Mrs Suvarna Suryawanshi and Dy Sarpanch Mr Chandrakant Gaykwad attended throughout the initiative and distributed food kits to the victims at the venue. They praised Muthoot Microfin's commitment to be a part of the flood relief operations in the village which was isolated following heavy rains.

We are dedicated to the cause of empowering rural women and improving their quality of life. While we undertake programmes based on the identified needs of the community - skill training, financial literacy and healthcare remains our priority.

Through hundreds of Community engagement activities organised in 2016–17 fiscal, Muthoot Microfin helped improve the lives of thousands of people around the country. We utilize our strengths and resources to benefit rural communities and particularly help women in learning a new skill and gain financial literacy. During the drought in Maharashtra last fiscal, Muthoot Microfin distributed drinking water to more than 500 families in Latur. Later that year, we conducted relief camps in Beed for people affected by the flood and 75 worst hit families were provided food and shelter by the organisation. All our community engagement initiatives are planned and executed by the employees – thus we ensure the participation of all staffs within the organisation on all social endeavours.

During last fiscal, Muthoot Microfin conducted several health care camps across the states in association with various organizations. The aim of these camps was to provide basic medical attention and medicines free of cost to those people who do not have easy access to basic medical facilities. A total of 1522 people benefitted from health camps during the fiscal. In all these camps, our medical teams host awareness session on women's health, nutrition, preventive measures to be observed during local disease outbreaks, among other health related topics.

Muthoot Microfin, through various skill training workshops for tailoring to candle making – trained 1922 women with vocational skills to help find earning opportunities or to start their own venture.

The company's environment protection programs were unique among the initiatives. Through our 'One Branch One Tree' program this fiscal, thousands of saplings were planted across 360 branches of Muthoot Microfin and our employees took oaths to protect it until it becomes a tree. Adding to this, another 895 saplings were distributed to general public and our clients on World Environment Day. Through programs like this, Muthoot Microfin reiterates its commitment towards environment protection and giving back to society.
